Chair Goldner:

The Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") issued a Commencement of Adjudicative Proceeding and Notice of Hearing on May 2, 2022 setting a hearing date in the above-referenced proceeding for June 23, 2022 at 9 a.m. On the same date, Hearing Guidelines were issued that required any request for a hybrid hearing format to be made no later than 15 days prior to the hearing (i.e., June 8, 2022).

Due to an unavoidable conflict that just came to light, Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Eversource" or the "Company") is submitting this late request for a hybrid hearing format to allow witness Edward A. Davis to participate remotely. On the date of the hearing, Mr. Davis will be in Upstate New York due to a previously scheduled and long-standing personal commitment, and thus unable to be physically present at the hearing. The conflict was not noticed until yesterday, which is why the Company is filing a late request. Mr. Davis sponsored testimony filed on April 29, 2022 regarding the calculation of lost base revenues due to net metering. Mr. Davis also co-sponsored testimony filed on April 29 2022 with witness Marisa B. Paruta regarding the bill impacts and necessary tariff revisions to implement the proposed regulatory reconciliation adjustment for August 1, 2022. Ms. Paruta and all other Eversource witnesses will be present at the hearing to participate in-person. Mr. Davis would be able to participate in the hearing remotely but is not able to appear in person without substantial hardship.

Accordingly, the Company respectfully requests accommodation for this late filed request.

The Company is authorized to represent that the Department of Energy and the Office of Consumer Advocate do not object to this request for remote hearing accommodations.
