Electric Distribution Utilities Consideration of Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure, Including Compensation of Customer-Generators

To the Commission:

Please treat this letter as a motion to make certain minor changes to the procedural schedule in the above-referenced docket. Specifically, the Office of the Consumer Advocate ("OCA") proposes to move the date for the filing of testimony from the OCA, the Department of Energy ("Department"), and intervenors from December 1, 2023 to December 6, 2023, to move the date for circulating data requests on this testimony from December 15, 2023 to December 19, 2023, and to move the date for responses to these data requests from January 9, 2024 to January 11, 2024. We seek no other changes to the schedule. Thus, if granted, this request would modify the procedural schedule for the remainder of the proceeding to read as follows:

The OCA is making this request for the following sheepishly tendered reason: Owing to human error on the part of the Consumer Advocate, the OCA neglected to issue certain data requests to the electric distribution utilities that were due on November 1, 2023. We did not send these requests to the utilities until November 13, 2023. In response, the utilities graciously agreed to provide responses by the end of November. At the technical session held in this docket earlier today, other parties requested some extra time to prepare testimony to take these anticipated

responses into account. That, in turn, led to the proposed slight adjustment to the ensuing round of discovery. In other words, all of the parties that participated in today's technical session, most especially the utilities, were extremely accommodating in the wake of my error. The OCA's witnesses would likewise welcome a few extra days to work on their testimony in these circumstances, although that is not a basis for the OCA's request.

Based on the discussion at the technical session, I am authorized to state that the Department, all three of the electric distribution utilities, Clean Energy New Hampshire, the Community Power Coalition of New Hampshire, Standard Power of America, and the Granite State Hydropower Association do not object to the requested scheduling change. There were no objections among the participating in the technical session.

I thank you for considering this request and apologize for any inconvenience.
